Dock monitors will soon set up a boat cleaning station near the dock ramp—slings, a bucket of river water, & towels for all rowers, but all who row CLUB boats must wipe down their boats & check for damage. Report repair needs in a new notebook in the Log In/Out box.

Kendal went from a snowcovered field to rowingready in 3 days in mid-April. The dock was installed on Thursday, the 13th, and on Saturday, our coaches organized hoards of Juniors, parents, Masters, and CReWbies into an efficient transformation machine. After trailers carried our big boats down to waiting slings, lots of volunteers hand-carried the club singles and doubles down the hill, laid them in temporary areas, rigged and covered the big boats, and set up the site. Meanwhile, a team of Juniors' parents drove our launches to Kendal from Wilson's Landing. By 1:00, the Juniors had a functioning big boat venue and Kendal was clear, ready for the rack project to begin.

On Monday, the Juniors were on the water, and five days later, they went to their first regatta. How cool is that!?
